Sahara Desert Trek

We suggest putting something about the Sahara Desert Trek challenge on your social media accounts as regularly as possible.

- Question: How big is the Sahara? Answer: The Sahara covers over 3.6 million square miles (only slightly smaller than the USA!) with 11 countries having part of it within their borders. They are Morocco, Libya, Algeria, Egypt, Tunisia, Chad, Eritrea, Niger, Mauritania, Mali, and the Sudan.
- **20.** (*Post pic of a camel*) Dromedary camels are not native to the desert but have been around for a long time. They are most often associated with the Sahara and were introduced approximately 200AD. Their advantages over horses include soft feet that are aligned so that they can move more quickly and easily through sand and their ability to go for up to 17 days without water or food. Make friends with some of these amazing creatures on our 2023 Sahara trek.
- 21. Some of Morocco's sand dunes at Erg Chebbi can reach a height of up to 150 meters in places. Altogether they span an area 50 kilometres north to south by 5 to 10 kilometres east to west lining the Algerian border. Tackle some of these incredible mounds of sand on our Sahara Trek.
- 22. Fun Fact: It is not hot all the time. Most people think of the desert as a giant furnace but during the months of December to February the night time temperature plunge well below freezing.We expect more comfortable overnight temperatures on our trek in [insert month]. Do you want to experience sleeping outside of your tent under the stars?
- **23.** During the summer season the temperature in the Sahara can exceed 50°C, some of the hottest days on the planet. Can you take the heat? Take up the challenge at [link to website]
- 24. Question: Does it rain in the Sahara? Answer: It does rain although not very often! It receives less than 7 cm of rain per year. Rainfall can range from twice in 1 week to extremes of no rain for three years!
